Basically our idea and goal by the project is "Through the experience of old projects make systematic new projects"

And we do believe, by this new projects also works for old projects.

We've done many water projects for children for 18 years in Northeast area in Thailand.

And we still have been keep making sure the situations of the projects.

Some are still doing well, many of the projects have subjects or problems.

Through this experiences, we found that if we depend on person's ability too much, it's difficult to keep doing well.

For example, once local person in charge is changed, many of the cases it's difficult to keep going the projects are doing well.

That's why we are trying to have new project as systematically.

We are trying to provide international level of health education for kids and we are also trying to sustain the project by local village cultures.

It might be sound irony however we found it's needed for projects's independence.

We'll provide international WASH program to rural area's kids.

We'll make a systems making and selling recycle soaps.

And the income by it spends for the maintainance of the clean water systems.

Those new system and new educational program by new program are also used for old projects which have subjects and problems.

For the WASH program we are planing on making Movie or short film as show cases for next generation group of community members to learn and benefit from our WASH program for children's health and sanitation.

Making Recycle soaps, some materials are each village's traditional local herbs or herds.

Conbination of the new technology and trational cultures are also our key words. Making a Recycle soap is very simple things however through the experience, they look over their own traditons and cultures.

We also believe, by this Recycle soaps they could take back their pride.

That's our clear goal for this project.

By the area survey,we found badly 8 elmentary schools in Buang Gan province doesn't have clean water with filtration systems.

2011/March/11 Buang Gan province was independed as a new province of Thailand.

According to the subdivision, the situation of the new area was more detailed and those kind of schools's probrem is getting more cleared.

And we are plannning to make those 8 schools to be model schools of the new Water projects in Northeast Thailand where the new Water projects will include relevant training to support Water project in long term. To provide children and villagers from rural areas in Northeast area in Thailand hygienically clean water together with appropriative filtration systems. Hygienically clean water with filtration system for the purpose of drinking and daily usage will be provided for children from schools and villages near and around the selected villages within North East area in Thailand.

North East Thailand where poverty is still a main obstacle in lives, we also found that water system is still insufficiently supplied which leads us to a problem of water scarcity and unclean drinking water for people in rural parts of Thailand. These particular problems have direct effect on children's health where the part of their growing up involves around food and water poisoning where children ending up with diseases caused mainly by drinking dirty water and using unfiltered water to live their lives.

By the area survey,we found badly 8 elmentary schools in Buang Gan province doesn't have clean water with filtration systems.

2011/March/11 Buang Gan province was independed as Thailand's new province.

According to the subdivision, the situasion of the area was more detailed and those kind of schools's probrem is getting more cleared.

Providing clean water with filtration system to schools in and all around Buang Gan province, children and villagers within areas could greatly benefit from this project with supply of hygienically clean and filtered water as a crucial part of their lives. Because of poverty, most of families in the area have problems getting clean drinking water, resulting in unhealthy living conditions especially for children and older generation.

And one more important for our goal are radicating health educaion for kids and the way of maintainance of clean water systems included independent financial by the projects.

We used to have same kind of clean water projects by MG in Northeast area.

Many clean water projects was successfully done, however we still have subjects about maintainance and kids education of hygiene.

In fact we've keep having Maintainance clean water projects at the schools we used to have the projects and fixing the systems by WCS projects.

But this maintenance project tought us we need to have this Global grant project to make those old projects, those villages and schools independent.

Even in our reserch, we have huge number of beneficiary by WASH training and training of the way of maintainance of clean water system included the way to get income for the maintainance by this projects are huge.

And by the locaion, Buang Gan province especailly those 8 schools have underprivillege students from Laos and Vietname.

We are planning to make video movie about WASH program and send it to the schools in their home countries too.

The students in Laos and Vietname are also our new targets for this projects.

Project planning

Describe the community needs that your project will address.

This Global Grant will eventually supply sufficient amount of clean water and appropriate filtration systems to schools, students, children and villagers from selected rural areas and to those who live in and around the selected areas where water and clean water system is highly a scarcity.

Due to the lack and insufficient supply of hygienically clean drinking water, children and villagers suffer from sicknesses and diseases caused by consumption of dirty and/or contaminated water. Schools and villages from rural areas in Northeast Thailand need to purchase drinking water from local businesses which can be costly to their already low income earnings as such purchase will have to be made daily. Therefore schools and people in the community tend to rely on rain water from rainy season which may or may not be sufficient all year round since rainy season in Thailand only lasts 4 months or less now that we are facing problems of Global Warming which effect rainy season's normal accuracy and its duration. Therefore, resulting in the

inevitable necessity to buy life water for most families and the schools also have finacially difficult probrems.

And one more important for our goal are building health educaion for kids and the way of maintainance of clean water systems included independent financial by the projects all around Northeast Thailand. Many schools in the area, Rotary and other organization had had clean water projects by such as Matching Grant.

And many of them still have subjects building kids education of hygiene and the way of maintainance of clean water systems included independent financial.

According to our reserch, some school can't use the clean water systems by those reason.

How did your project team identify these needs?

According to intensive project surveys, we found that 8 schools within Amphur Pakkard within Buang Gan province in Northeast are in fact in critical needs for help from our project. Project surveys have been conducted for primary school students from age 7-12 years old and secondary school students from age 12-16 years old and as well as for the villagers who live all around selected schools.

This Global Grant project will provide solution in solving lack of clean drinking water to approximately 1,000 students from 8 schools and minimum estimated number of 4,000 villagers from rural areas of Amphur Pakkard and villages within Buang Gan province Northeast, Thailand.

During the reserch, we also found And one more important for our goal are Training and the way of maintainance of clean water systems by the projects.

We used to have same kind of clean water projects by MG.

Many clean water projects was successfully done, however we still have subjects about maintainance and kids education of hygiene.

In fact we've keep having Maintainance clean water projects at the schools we used to have the projects and fixing the systems by WCS projects.

But this maintainance project tought us we need to have this Global grant project to make those old projects, those villages and schools independent.

Even in our reserch, we have huge number of beneficiary by WASH training and training of the way of maintainance of clean water system included the way to get income for the maintainance by this projects are huge.

And by the locaion, Buang Gan province especailly those 8 schools have underprivillege students from Laos and Vietname.

We are planning to make video movie about WASH program and send it to the schools in their home countries too.

According to several interview sessions with HEADS OF PROVINCIAL COMMERCE OF BUANG GAN-NONGKHAI HEADS OF PROVINCIAL TREASURY OF BUANG GAN-NONGKHAI we found that families within our selected areas in Buang Gan; Amphur Pakkad, Amphur Se Ga and Amphur Porncharoen have the lowest income earnings in recording systems and statistics. The monthly income of each family member from these rural areas is listed to be approximately 2,000 BAHT (Approximately 60 US DOLLARS which is approximately 24,000 BAHT Approximately 700 US DOLLARS per annual per person) In the North-East area of Thailand, about 80 per cent of the population comes from farming and agriculture backgrounds, these selected three areas in particular, where younger population tends to seek jobs or attempt to survive their livings in bigger cities such as Bangkok and industrial area such as Korat which makes it rather difficult or almost impossible to afford having their children living with them in bigger cities where incomes and earnings will not suffice. Inevitably, the younger generation from first borns onward will be left behind at home for their grandparents to take care of, while parents are struggling for more financial supports by working within the big cities.

We had meetings with local schools the target for clean water systems.

And we also had meeting some schools we had clean water projects such as by MG.

And the projects at the schools mostly more than 10 years ago.

And we found future subjects of the new Global Grant projects by the situations of old projects.

Local authorities such as sub-provincial municipality also play significant role in helping the clarity of needs for severe lack of clean drinking water for schools in the community. These local authorities will help in organising long-term maintenance plans and management of this Global Grant project.

The benefiting communities assistance is highly crucial. School principals, teachers and school officials from each particular school help in forming local teams which include the Head of each village and parents to assist Rotarians during project surveys. Each school team consists of Principal, teachers, students, parents, Heads of villages and villagers. These assigned local committee members will serve as project management team from the beginning of this global grant project, these project management team members are an integral part of need identification, research and data collection, identifying needs for necessary and hands on training to assist the project outcomes and long-term maintenance and future problem solving solutions.

On the job training of making recycled soaps class to achieve our goal

The objectives of this training and the training curriculum are as followed:

1. Making samples of message card.

It will put into the package of Recycled soaps.

[&]quot;by the handbooks and movies to the students.

It has 3 important messages as below,

- How important WASH for students.
- The soap was made from the waste of used soaps by local hotels and how important to work in the community about the Environmental protection.
- The maintenance of the clean water systems will be covered by the profit by the soaps.

The community members gather local expertise and know-hows of installation and maintenance of filtration equipments. Therefore each school will have the help from local technicians ready for the given tasks. Those particular tasks will include knowing how to operate filtration systems and how to keep the filtration systems well-functioned at all times. Teachers, students and village representatives who have been assigned for these tasks will have to undergo training from the start as well as during the progress of this global grant project in order to ensure the ability to maintain excellent hygiene and cleanliness of clean water filtration systems.

Assigned team members consist of school principals, teachers, student representatives and village representatives. These members will be responsible for overall project maintenance and will handover reports of water filtration weekly usage and problems that occur during using clean water filtration systems.

Clean water project training will also include post installation process of monthly cleaning process of equipments such as filers, tubes, and stainless steel tanks and system. Participants of monthly cleaning process of filtration system consist of student representatives assigned from schools and villager representatives from villages. By having representatives present at training, existing problems will immediately be informed and solutions to those problems will be fixed correctly and quickly.

Need identification, project objectives and process to achieve those objectives derive from working together with school head masters, teachers, officers, students and parents. With their enthusiastic participations and supports, Rotarians are able to gather necessary details in forming the project needs, objectives, process and plans in which this global grant project will progress effectively and efficiently. Many visits and meetings with the mentioned community members are inevitably crucial to help us with correct training plans in which the community will need to achieve the sustainability of project which will be granted to them.

Assigned teams for each school will conduct the sanitation trainings, home-made soap classes and clean water maintenance monitoring and evaluation on a weekly process and will handover a monthly reports to Rotary after water filtration systems have been completely installed and in use. Monitoring and evaluating clean water project will include help and cooperation from villagers who will have access to supply of hygienically clean water from Rotary clean water project. People from nearby area of schools will be able to get their daily consumption of clean water and that will naturally help to give them basic lives needed as human being. After this project is done, those each 8 schools will be nominated as a "Model school of Rotary water project in Northeast"

and other schools come over and learn the systems.

How were these needs identified?

We've been visiting the schools used to had projects such as Water projects even old projects to see the situation of projects ,schools and villages in Northeast. We also have meetings with teachers and villagers as well

Because of the visiting and meeting, we found a lot of necessity.

In order to reach the sustainability of this Global Grant, it is highly crucial that people from each living community play their part of involvements towards the project. Local businesses devote their support for this Global Grant Project to reach its focus of maintaining the functionality of given equipments. By getting local businesses to involve in our project from the school's Recycled soap making program, the community will achieve the on-going assistance in supply such as monetary compensation to help maintain the hygiene and cleanliness of water filtration systems.

For the final training, we'll invite representative teachers from all the provinces in Northeast Thailand as trainees.

Because schools in whole area Northeast have been having similar subjects.

We have 27 provinces in the area and local Rotary clubs will pick target schools.

Representative 3 trainee teachers from each provinces will be invited to each school in Buang Gan province and will have the Soap making training and WASH training as OJT.

The Representative 3 trainees will get the recycle soaps which is based on One village One product as insentives.

We will encourage to the representative teachers to make their own special soaps to use local herbs ,local fruits and local specialty by the training.

Buang Gan municipality included health public, Heads of villages and local communities/authorities will help provide long-term maintenance and responsibilities for this global grant. It is the main objective of this project to gather local involvements to ensure the project sustainability, hence, implementing sense of ownership for locals such as teachers, students and villagers from their continuous participation towards the project would be highly necessary. This will strengthen the capability and ability

of local communities to develop consistency of project maintenance and sustainability of our clean water project filtrations and sanitation systems after this global grant project has been funded.

In order to achieve long-term sustainability of this project, Buang Gan municipality, Heads of villages and local communities/authorities will take part in training of clean water filtration maintenance. Supporting training programs for participants and representatives will be enhanced to reach communities' awareness of the benefits of hygiene, water sanitation and more importantly people in communities will learn the benefits of value of water and how to use it wisely.

Training of daily operations and regular management of maintenance of clean water filtration system will also be given to teachers, students, janitors, and villagers.

Selected representatives from schools and villages for Self-sustainabilty project will undergo intensive trainings provided by selected supplier and local technicians for clean water project. Trainings will include the improvisation of water filtration systems from installation, operation and maintenance of equipments and functions where thorough understandings of water filtration systems will be outlined and handling guidelines will be allocated in training sessions for each school.

Community members including teachers, students and villagers will obtain their own incentives for changing filtration filters and replacement parts that might occur during usage of equipments.

Each school will implement their own fund raising project which will assist and prolong regularity and maintenance of clean water filtration system. The fund raising project refers to financial support from Recycled soap making program and activities to support long term maintenance of the given project. Together with the incentives and financial support from the community who has access to filtered clean water to use at home by paying minimal amount of money as contribution to Clean Water Project to schools, resulting in continuous increase of project life span and its filtration systems and equipments from changing filters on the regular basis for instance.

Clean water filtration systems and the equipments are within easy and flexible reach locally. This global grant project seeks reliable advices from successfully completed clean water projects from Rotary club of Korat from RID 3340 and Rotary club of Bangkok Klongtoey from RID 3350. According to the Self sustainability project, Income for ongoing project funding from school's Recycled soap making activity and program will provide continuous support for this global grant after the project has been given to the schools. Minimal incentives will be acquired through this school project in order to replace parts and filters to maintain well-function and usage of the given equipments.

Community members including teachers, students and villagers will obtain their own incentives for changing filtration filters and replacement parts that might occur during usage of equipments of this global grant project.

Each school will implement their own fund raising activities which will assist and prolong regularity in maintenance of clean water filtration system. The fund raising activities refer to financial support from school's Recycled soap making program and from everyone who has access to filtered clean water to use at home by paying minimal amount of money as contribution to Rotary Clean Water Project to schools, resulting in continuous increase of project life span and its filtration systems and equipments such as changing filters on a regular basis for instance. By having local communities involve in generating income for clean water filtration systems, this global grant project will be providing equitable community access to safe water and improvement of sanitation, health and hygiene of the overall communities.

For continuation and ongoing project funding, representatives from school and communities will be selected and acted as accounting department where incentives as a part of community contribution from parents, students, local communities and families will be collected, handled and reported to school principals, heads of communities, local authorities and RID-3340 for final reporting progress and process. Costs of equipments such as regular change of filters will be covered within possible system and reach.

Regularity of change of filters will result in well-functioned of Clean water filtration systems as well as good quality of hygienically clean drinking water, hence, sanitation for the children and living communities in Buang Gan province can be achieved in the long-term process.
